








On receiving information about this visit, the locals of Bhaddiya prepared to welcome Lord Buddha and the monks.





The setthi Mendaka called his granddaughter and said




Visakha set off her journey along with her retinues.








She and her retinues bowed down in respect to Lord Buddha and the monks.
After that, they sat down at a convenient place.






After the sermon, Visakha and her retinues were in a deep state of understanding Dhamma




Visakha attained












He had a son named Punnavaddhana, who was getting into marriageable age. He wanted his son to get married at the earliest possible time, so he told his son.









The Brahmins gave up their mission and headed their way back towards Savatthi.






While on the way back to Savatthi, as they entered the outskirts of Saketa, they saw an ongoing festival. The Brahmins thilled by seeing it.



This was a festival being organised every year in Saketa. During this festival, all the ladies, both rich and poor, would participate and marched towards the river bank to celebrate it.




During this festival, Kings and Princes, wealthy merchants and as such would wait in search of a suitable woman to propose.







In fact, this festival had not been celebrated as just an occasion for happiness but even to look in search for a future bride as well.



Visakha who was about sixteen by that time began marching towards the river bank with her retinues to participate in the festival.








Visakha, on the other hand, walked calmly with a regular pace and entered the shelter gracefully.










As the Brahmins wanted to see and inspect Visakha's teeth, they pretended to gossip about her with a voice audible enough to be heard by Visakha.


















Those days they used to have closed door chariots to transfer noble members of the town, and specially grown up female family members.


Dhananjaya accepted the proposal and asked the Brahmins to convey his message to Migara.










Upon receiving the reply, Migara left only some guards in his mansion and he even called all the city folks who wish to follow them and departed for Saketa.







On reaching about just half a league (yojana) distance to reach Saketa, they decided to rest and sent a messenger to Dhananjaya.





















Visakha's father Dhananjaya was busy preparing a wedding dress for his daughter. He called the best five hundred Goldsmiths from Saketa, hired them for the task.






As the Mahalatapasadhana was being made for Visakha, her wedding had to be postponed and everybody waited for it to be completed.




After some days, King Pasenadi out of compassion, didn't want to be a burden for Dhananjaya said:





From that moment on, Dhananjaya made everyone in Saketa feel as if they were in a continual festival.







Which made each of them feel the special hospitality of the Setthi



This became the norm for the upcoming days, and time passed to a period of three Months. But the making of Mahalatapasadhana had not been completed yet.






By that time, the Goldsmiths completed the Mahalatapasadhana and the guests had been in Saketa for four months.



Mahalatapasadhana was made with four nali of diamonds, eleven nali of pearls, twenty two nali of coral, thirty three nali of rubies, one thousand nali of gold and decorated with other valuable items as well.




The parure began from the head and reached till the ankle. It was also decorated in various places with gold and silver.



During Kassapa Buddha's time, Visakha was born as Sanghadasi; the youngest of the seven daughters of King Kiki.




In that life, she donated robes, needles, threads and dyeing materials to twenty-thousand monks.




After Visakha's marriage was celebrated with great pomp, Dhananjaya gave five-hundred carts full of money, five hundred carts full of gold, five hundred carts full of silver, five hundred carts each full of copper, silk garments, butter, husked and winnowed rice, ploughshares and other farm implements to Visakha to take it with her to her husband's house.




Dhananjaya also prepared five hundred chariots with three beautiful and richly dressed attendants on each of the chariots






Three sttendants went to a distance a three quarters of one yojana with each holding a drum.




When the cattle occupied the allotted space and stood so closed to each other, the attendants sounded the drums.
