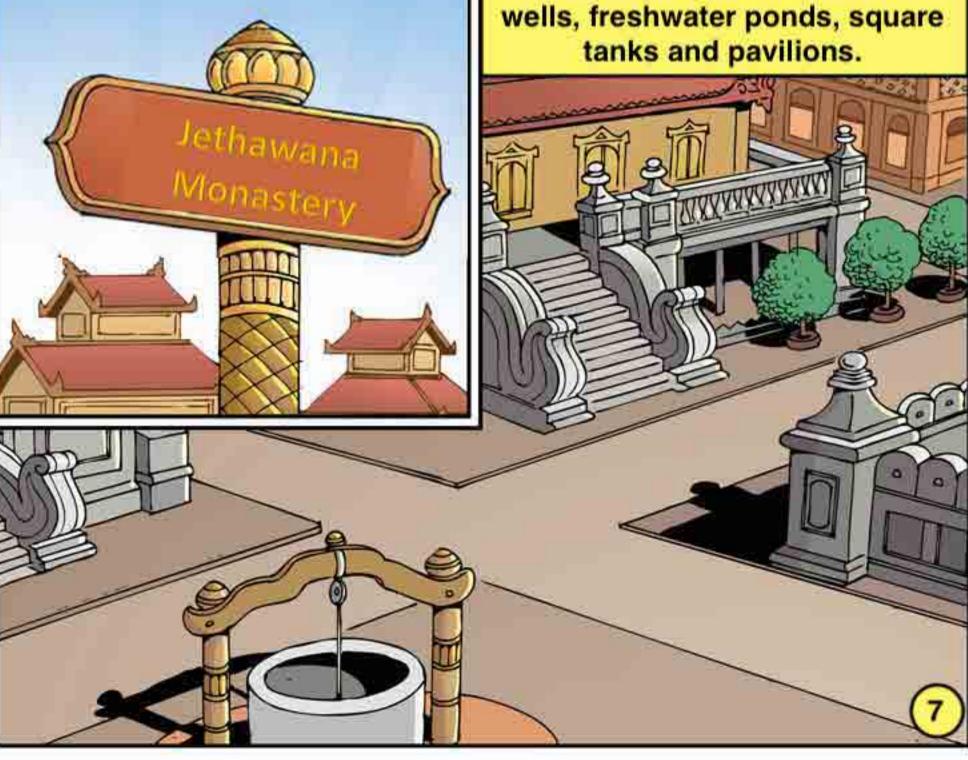




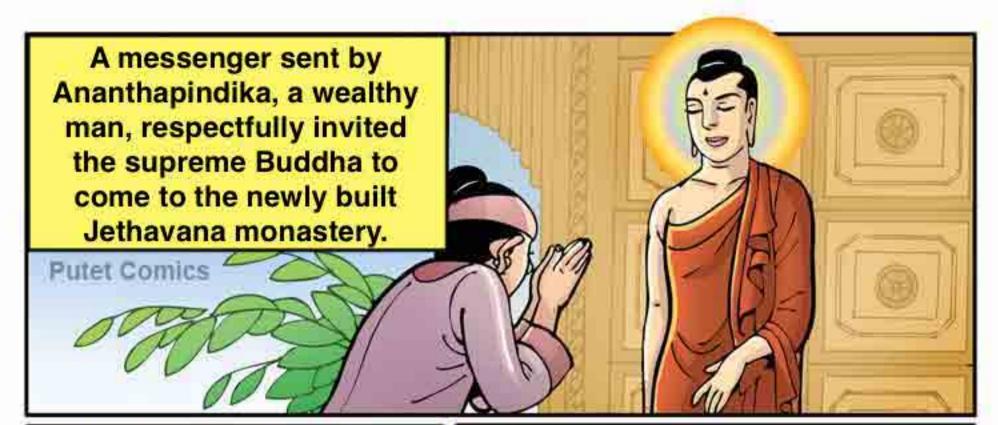




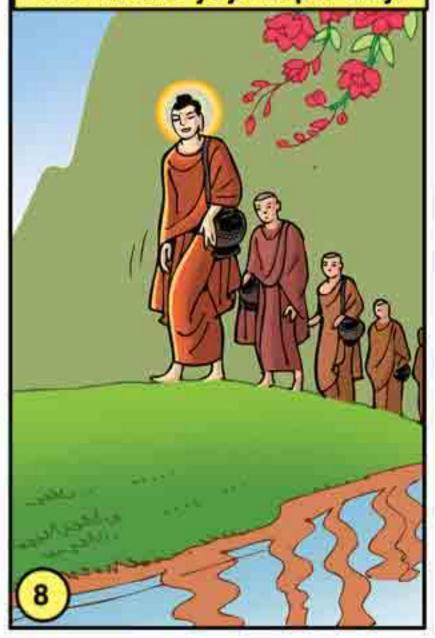




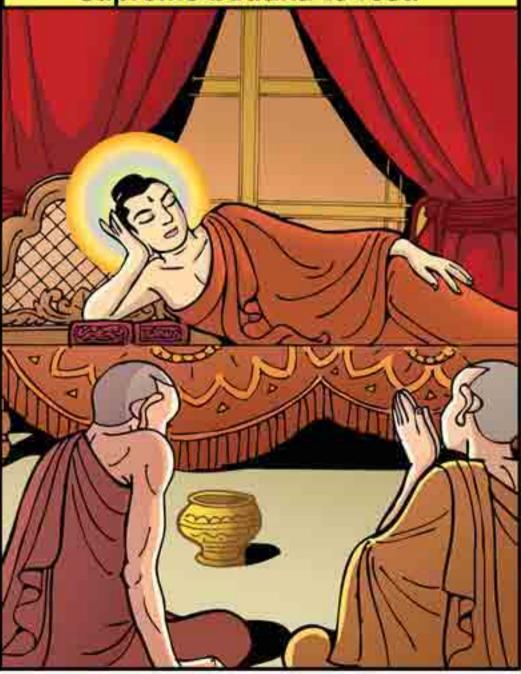
Our supreme buddha's journey to the city of Savatthi.



Our Supreme Buddha, escorted by monks went to the city of Savatthi, which was 45 yojanas far away at a rate of one yojana per day.



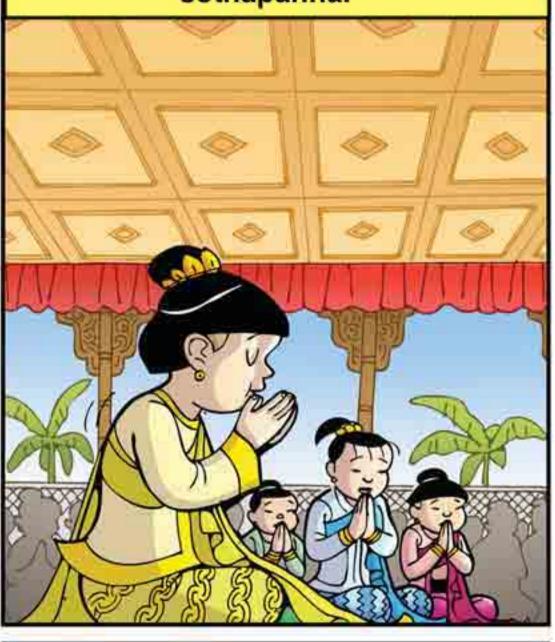
On the 45 yojana way, wealthy Ananthapindika have put up monasteries every yojana for our supreme buddha to rest.

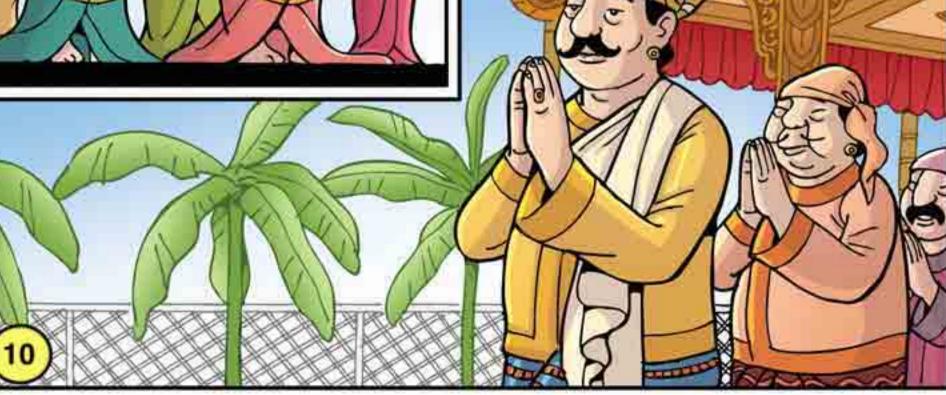

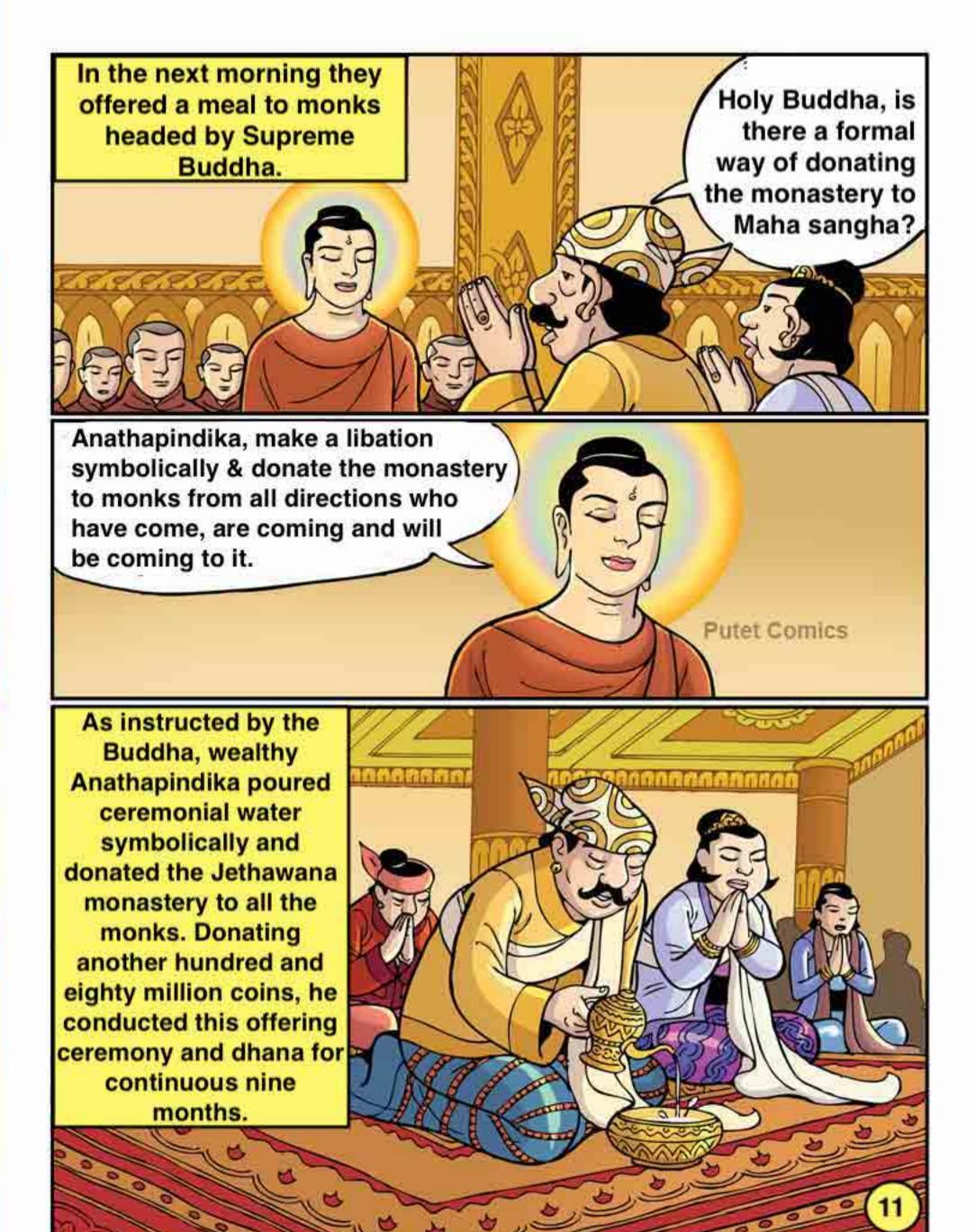

At the end of the procession, wealthy Anathapindika and five hundred wealthy men respectfully welcomed and invited the Buddha.



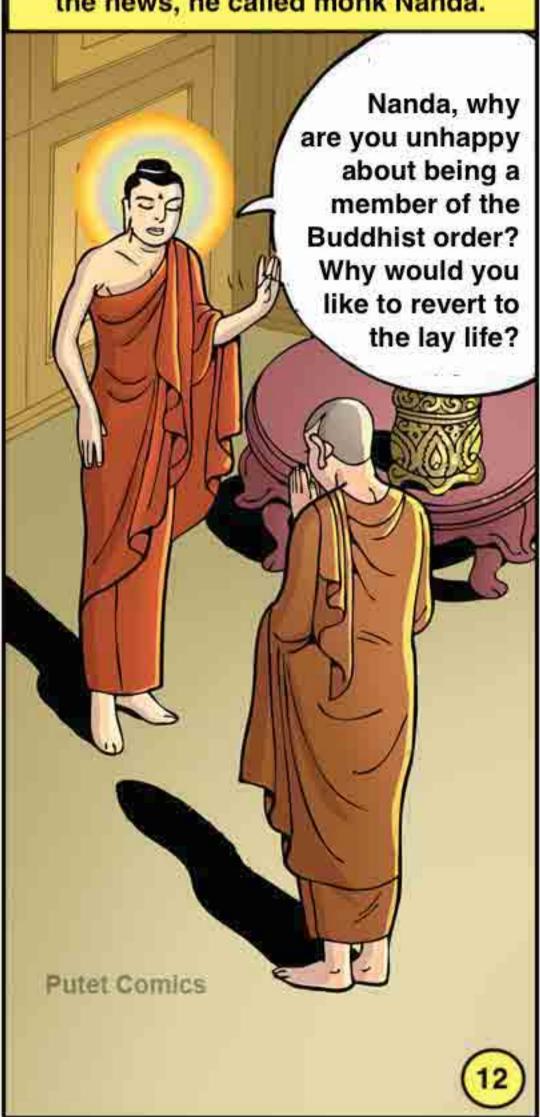


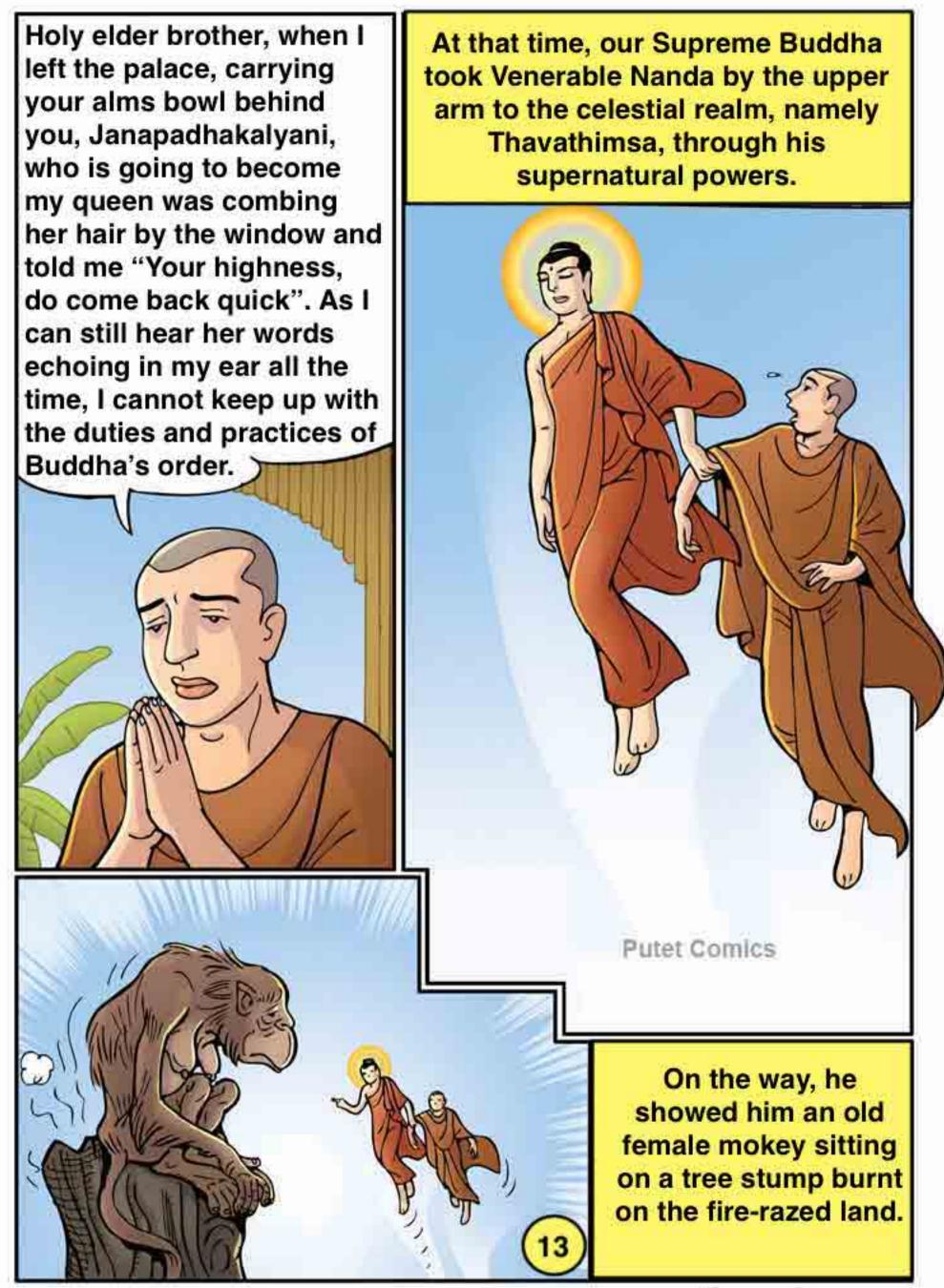
### Younger brother Monk Nanda becoming an Arahant

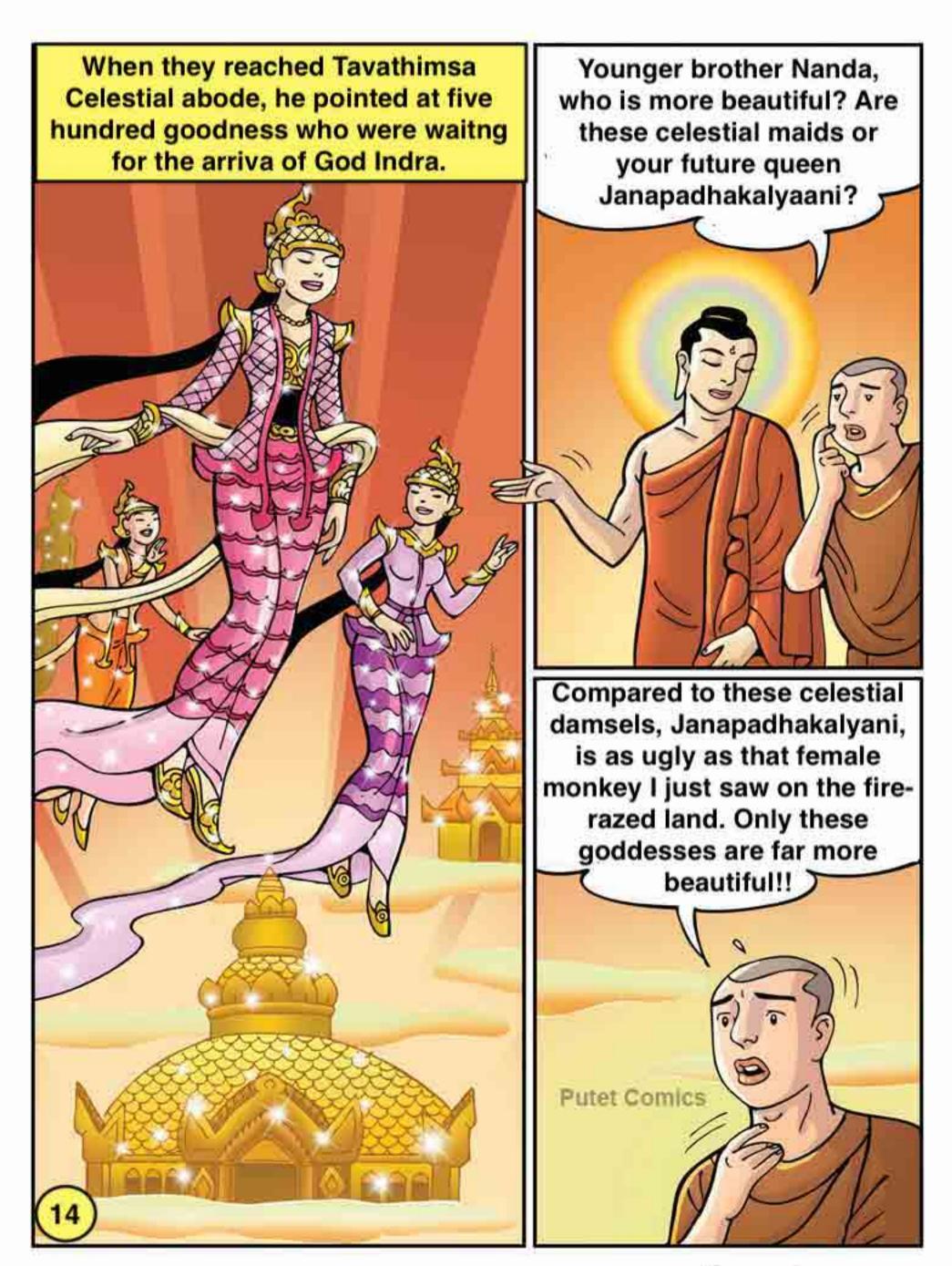
While the Buddha was sojourning at the Jethavana Monastery, one day monk Nanda said,

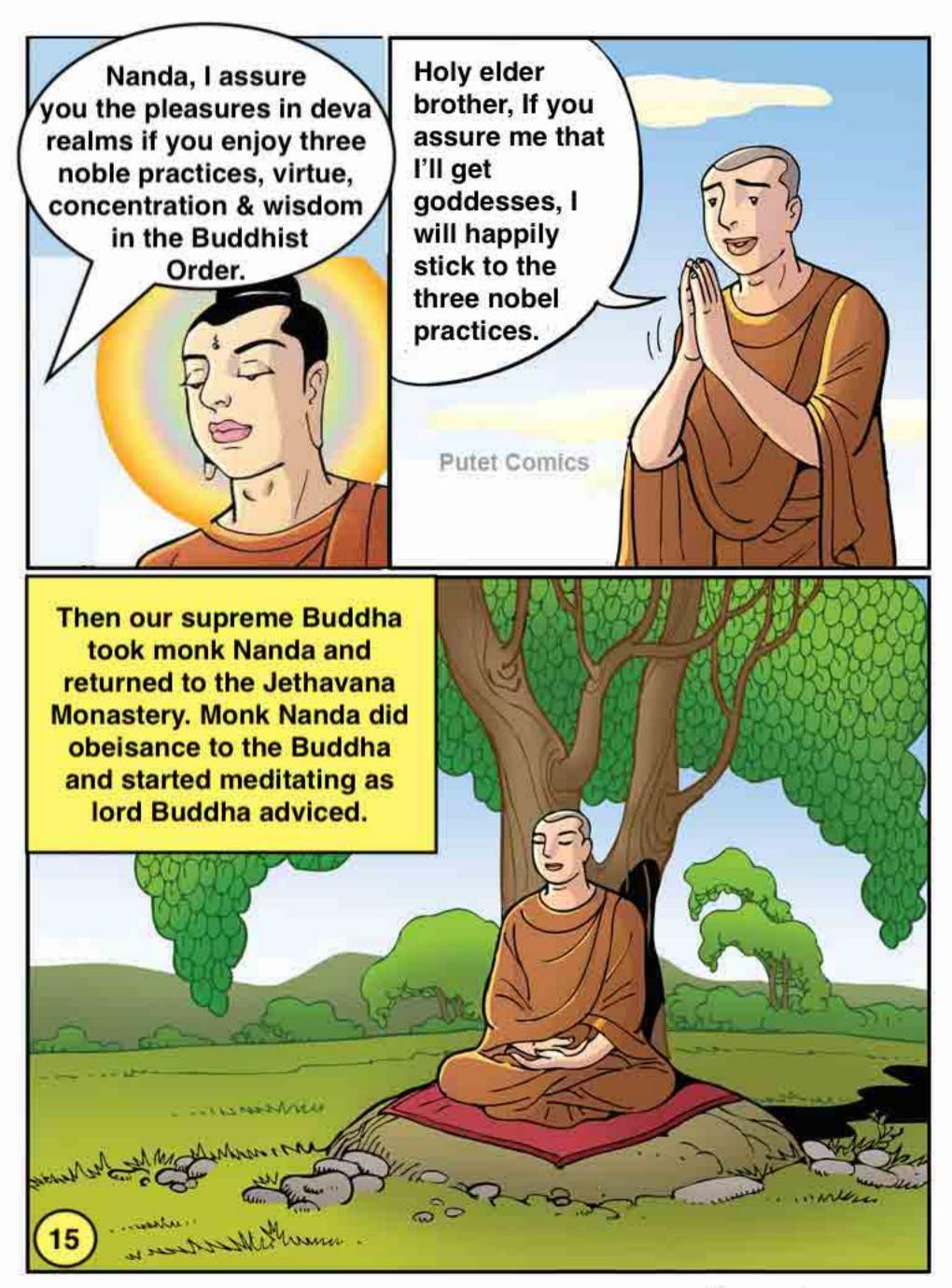
Fellow monks, I am unhappy in the Buddhist order. As I cannot continue my duties as a monk any more I will leave and live as a lay person.

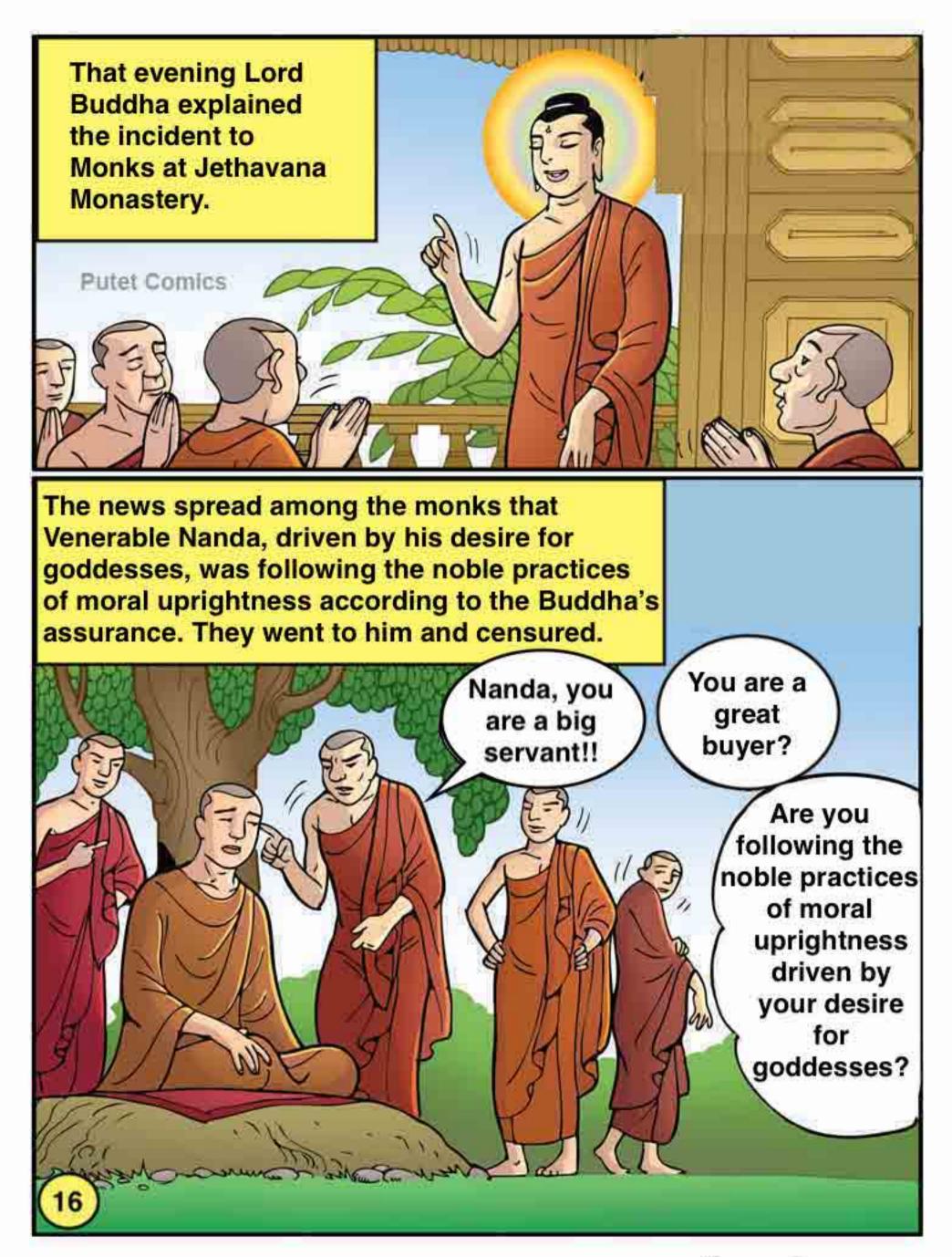
When our Supreme buddha heard the news, he called monk Nanda.



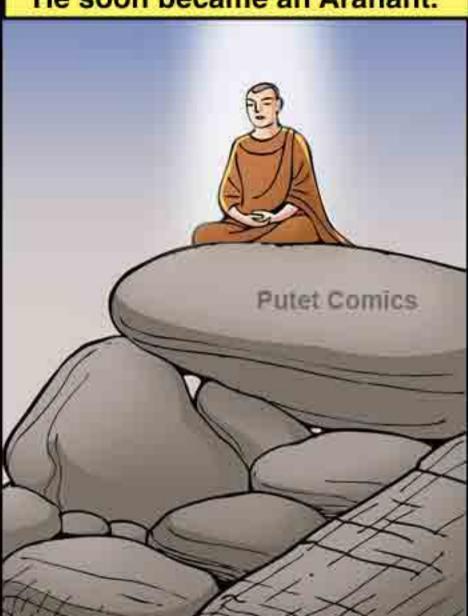

At midnight, an Arahant-Brahma came close to the Buddha and addressed.

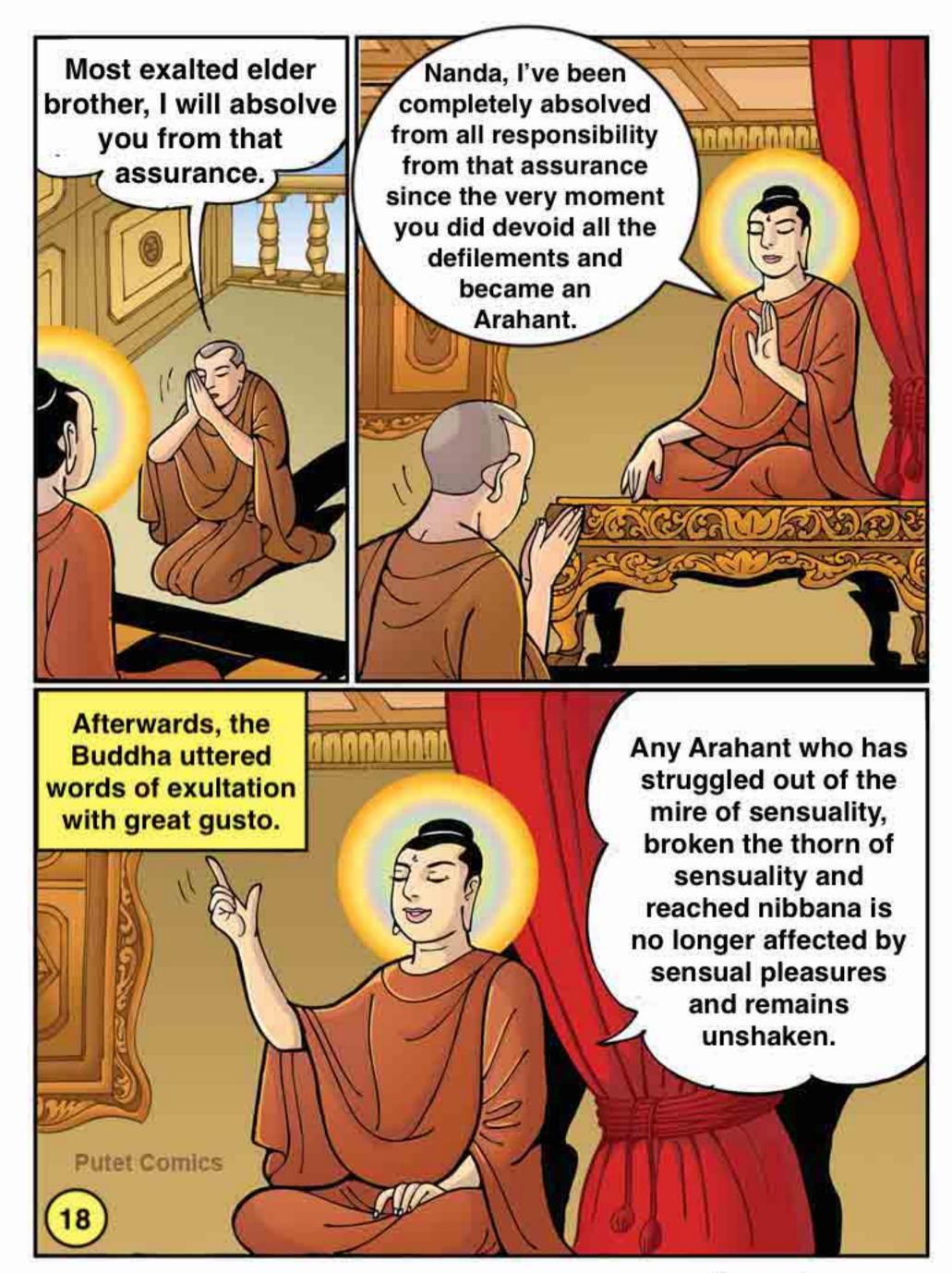


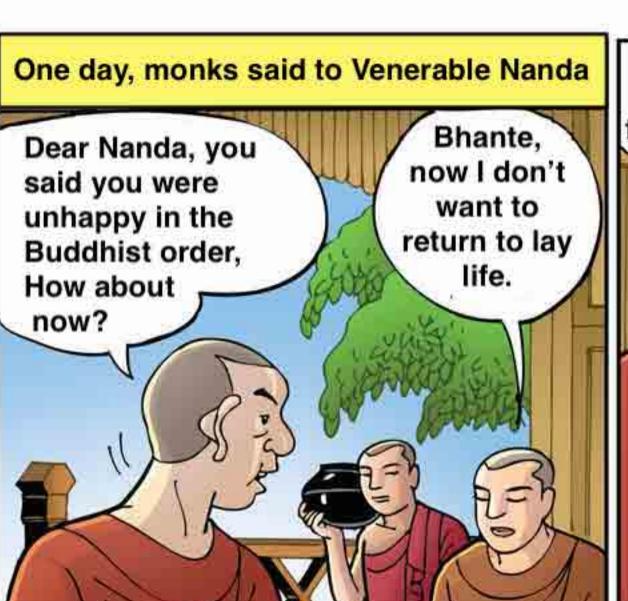
The next morning, Venerable Nanda approached the Lord Buddha.



Holy elder brother, you assured me of possession of goddesses if I practice well in Buddha's order?









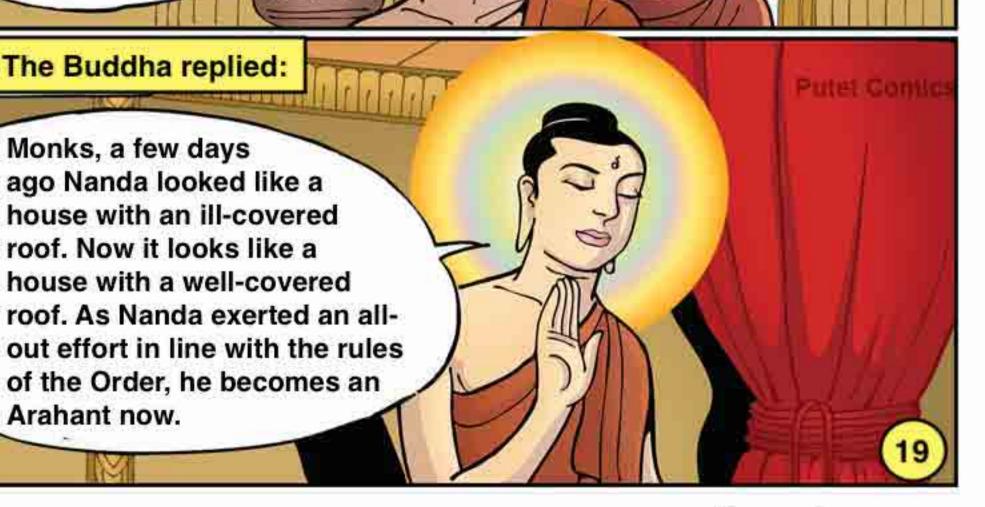

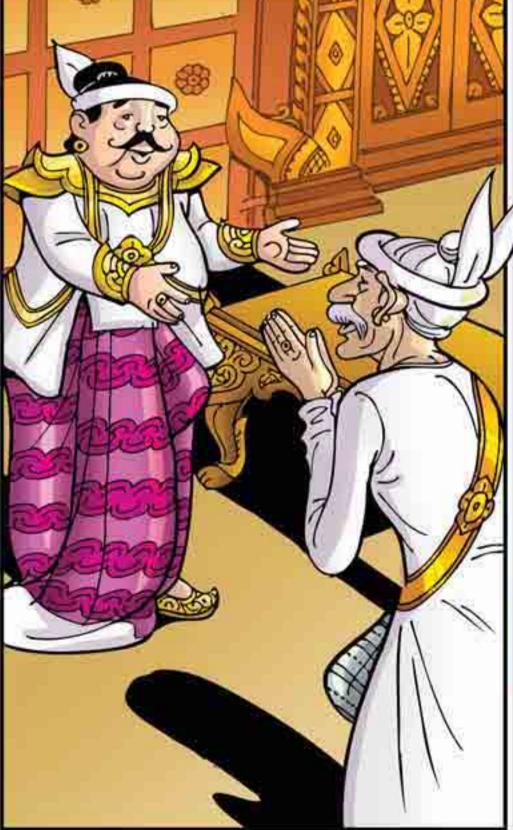

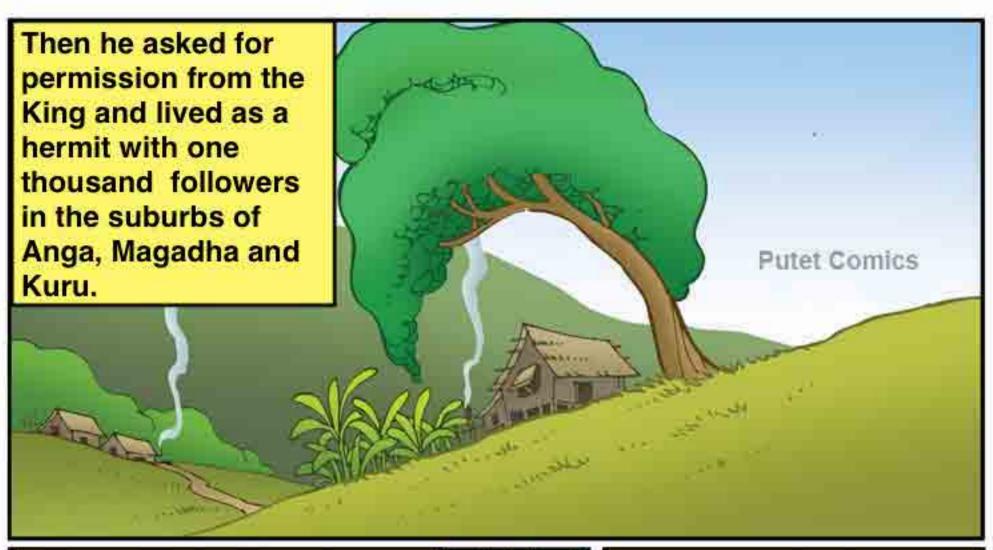
## Removing the wrong views of one thousand hermits headed by Aggidatta

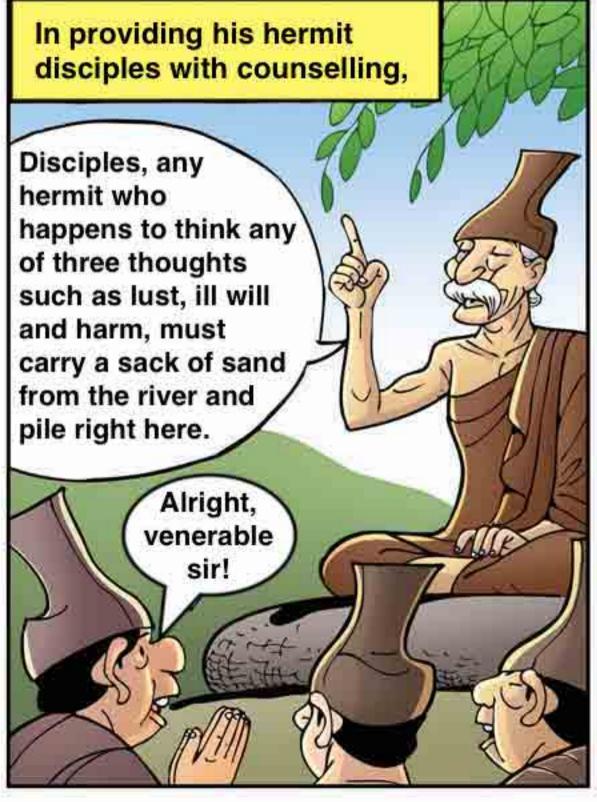

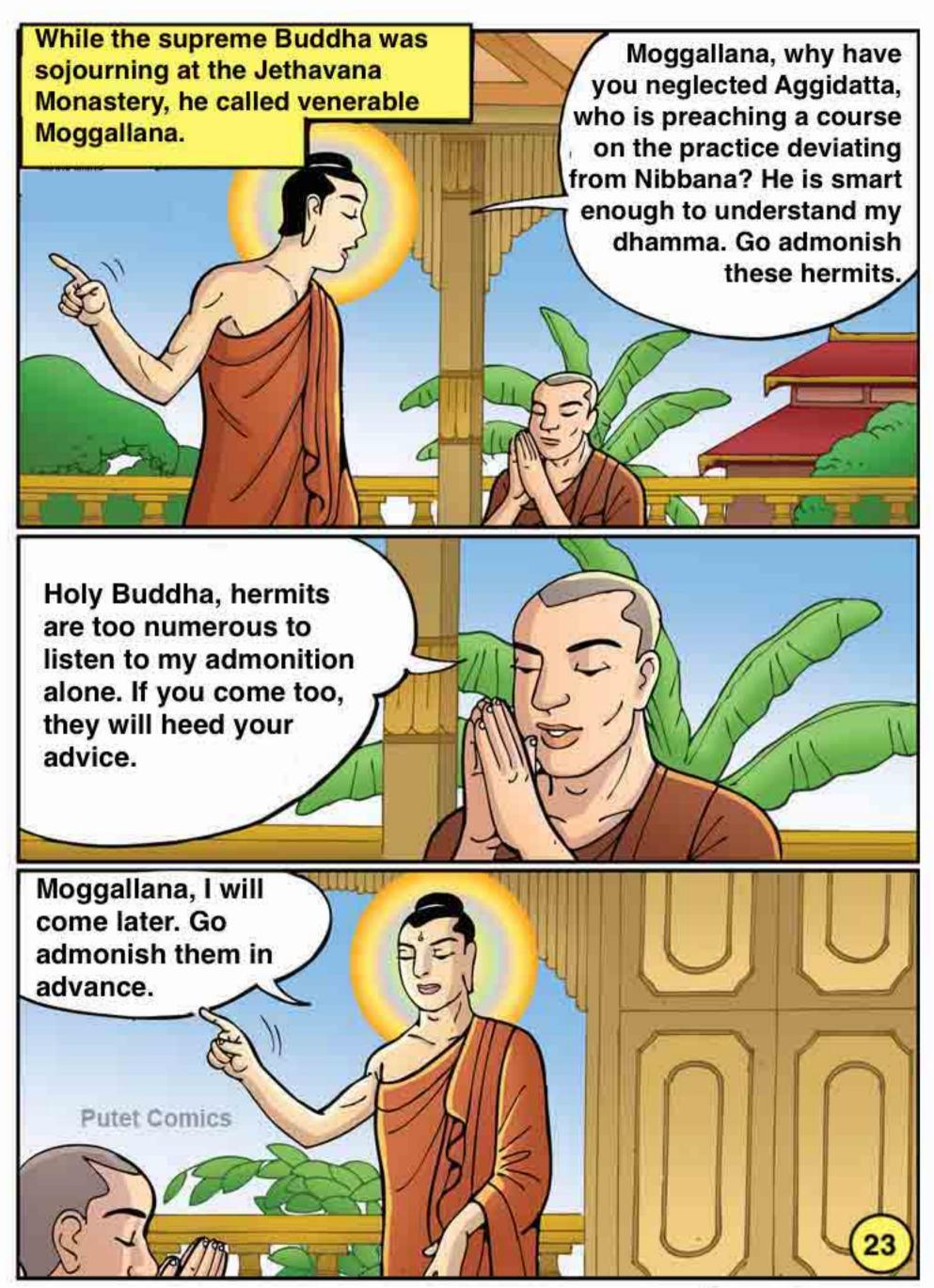
Day by day, it became a huge pile of sand. There ruled the king of dragon named Ahichatta in this pile.



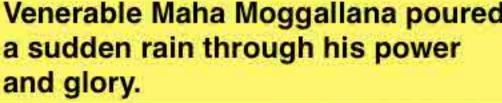


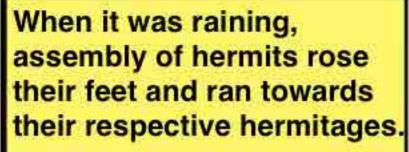


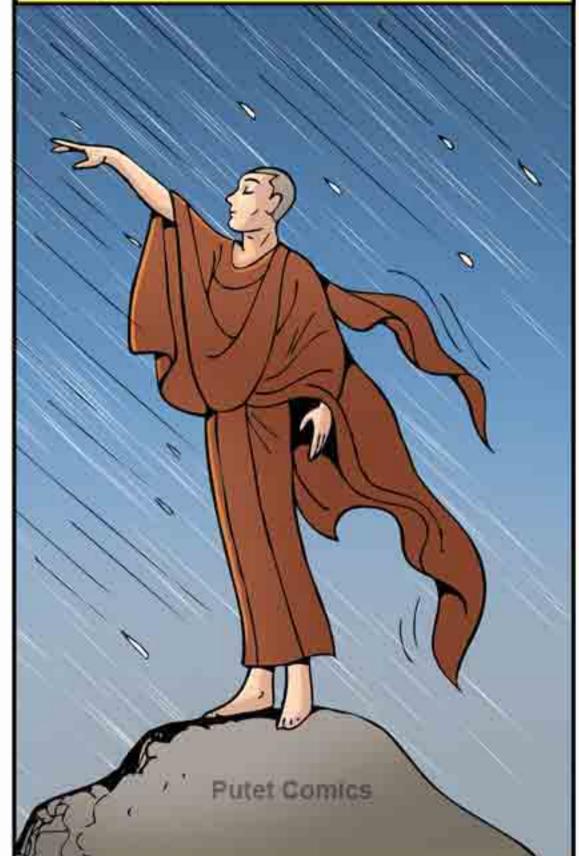




Venerable Maha Moggallana poured a sudden rain through his power

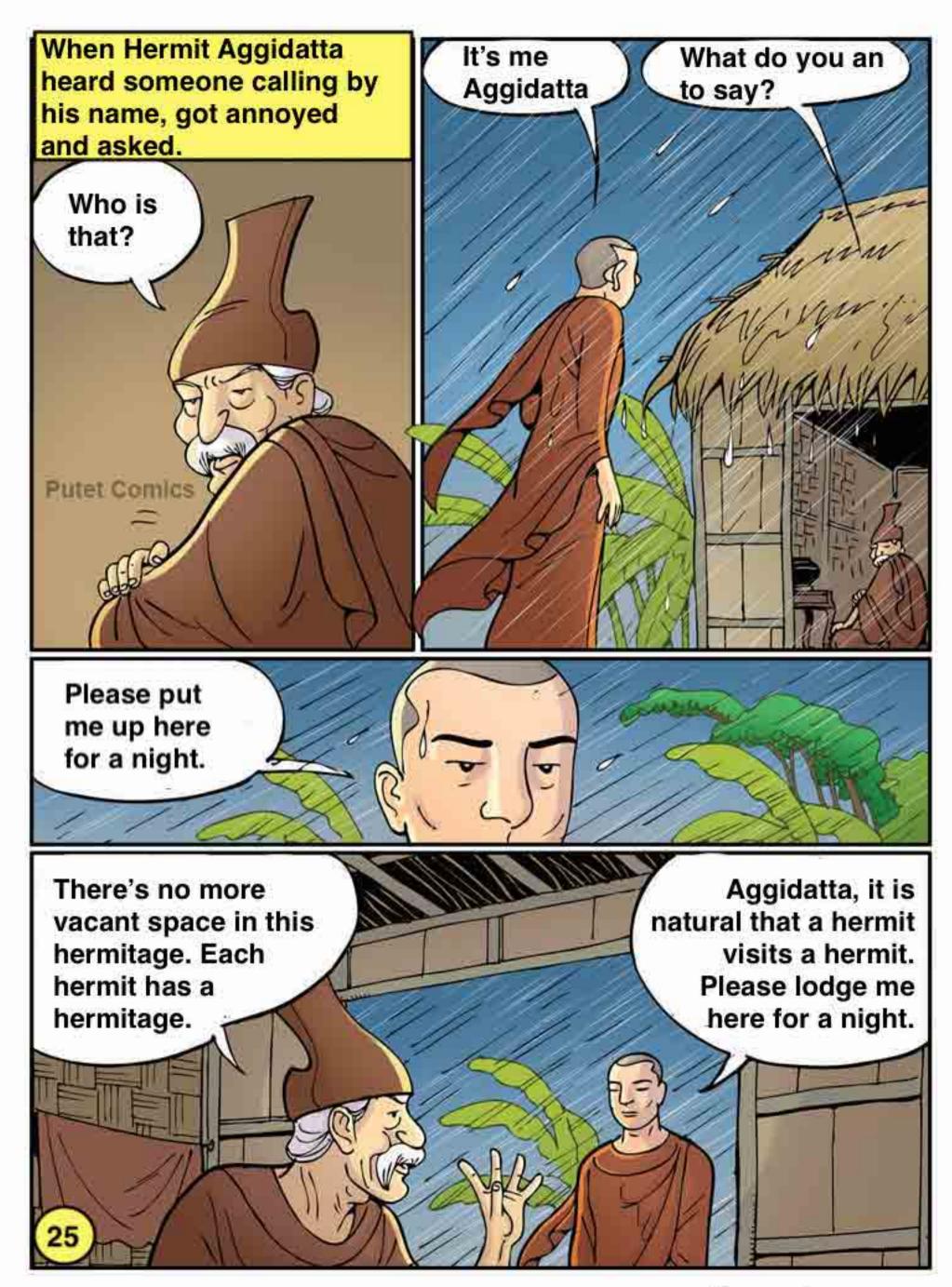


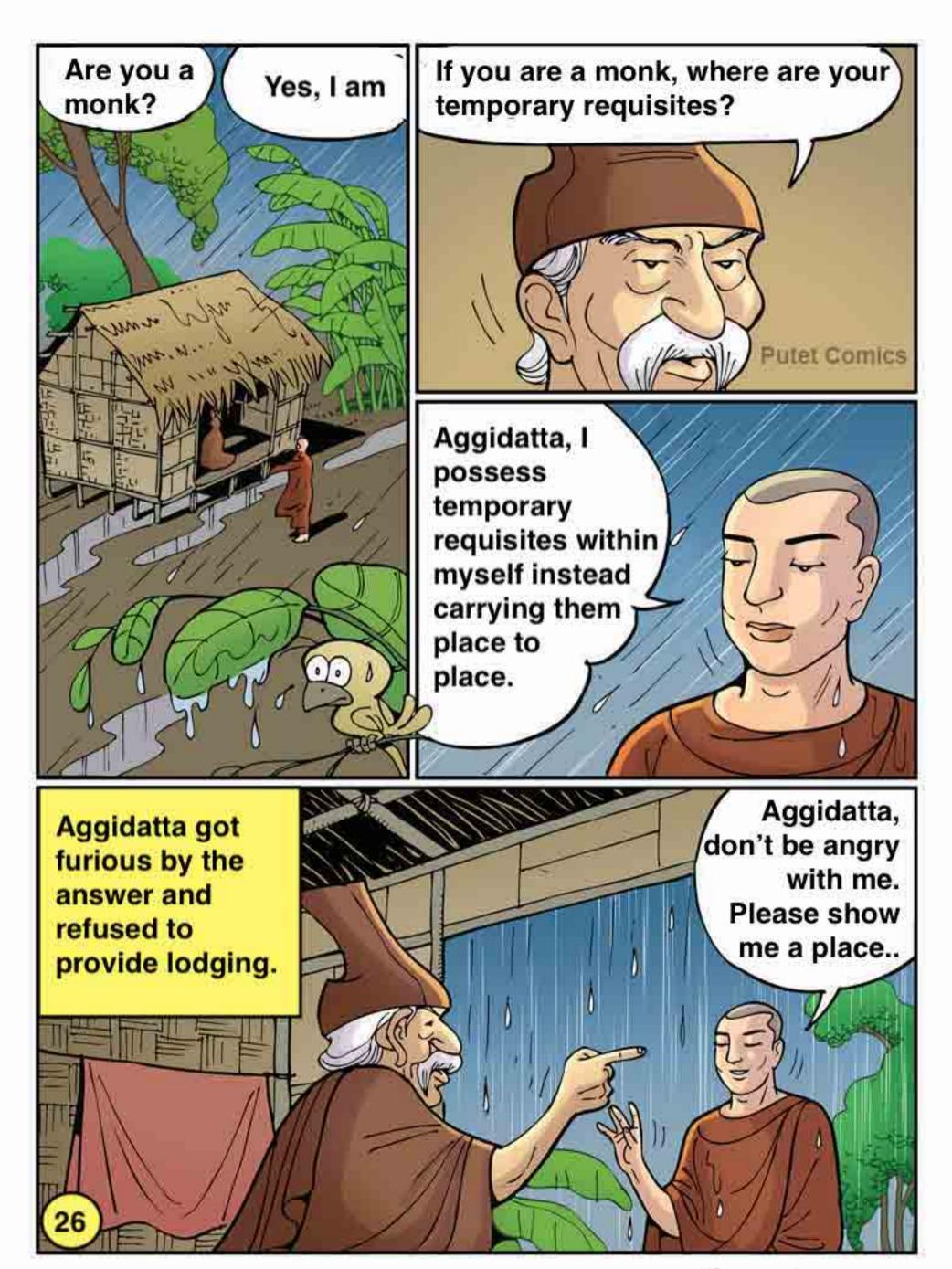


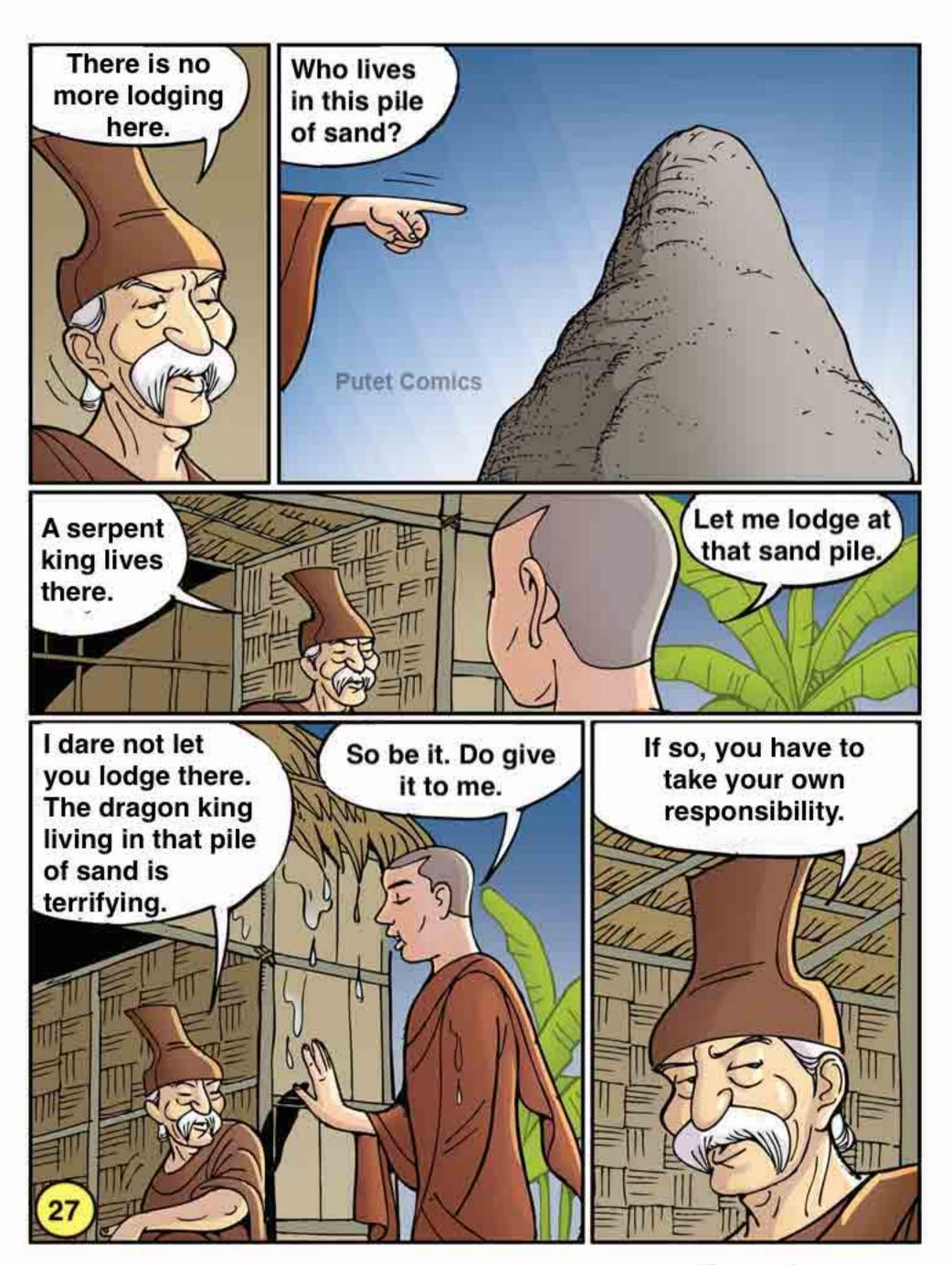




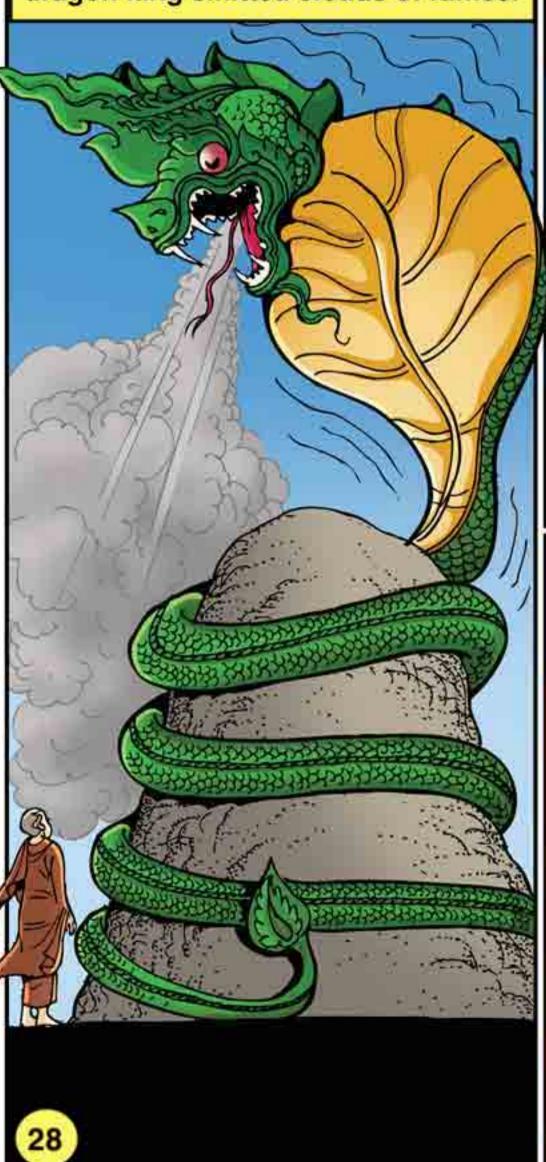




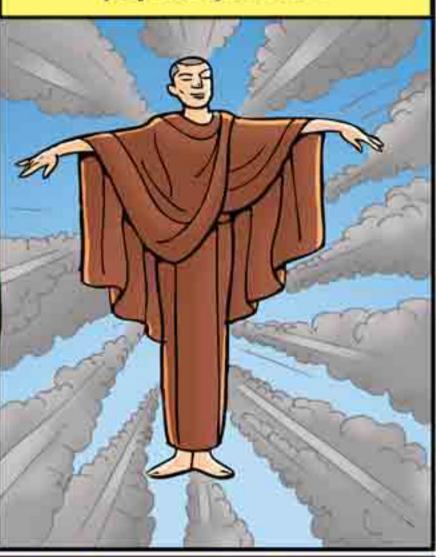




When the king of Serpents, named Ahichatta saw Venerable Moggallana approaching the pile of sand, the dragon king emitted clouds of fumes.



Venerable Maha Moggallana gave off fumes too by his psychic powers .



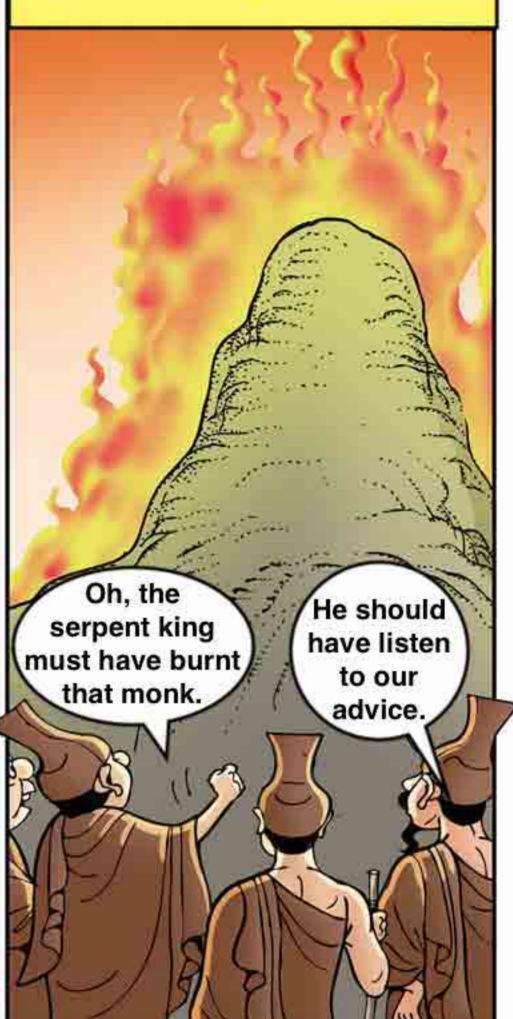
As Serpant King Ahichatta could not withstand the fumes, he produced flames, boiling with rage.



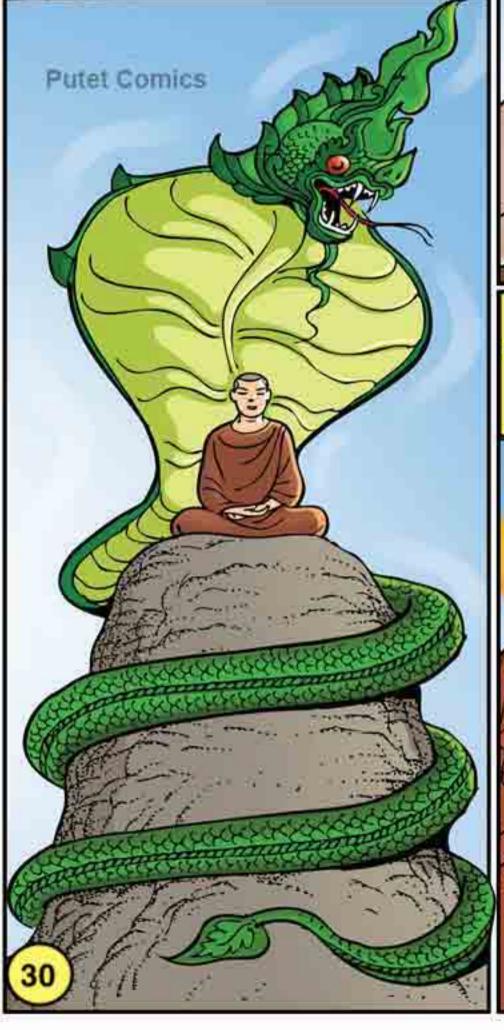

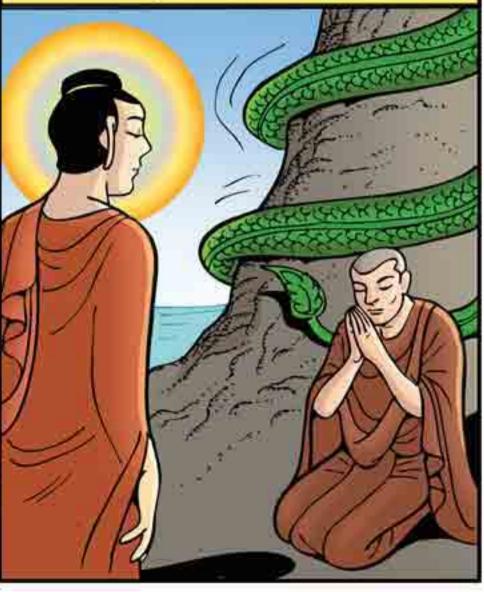


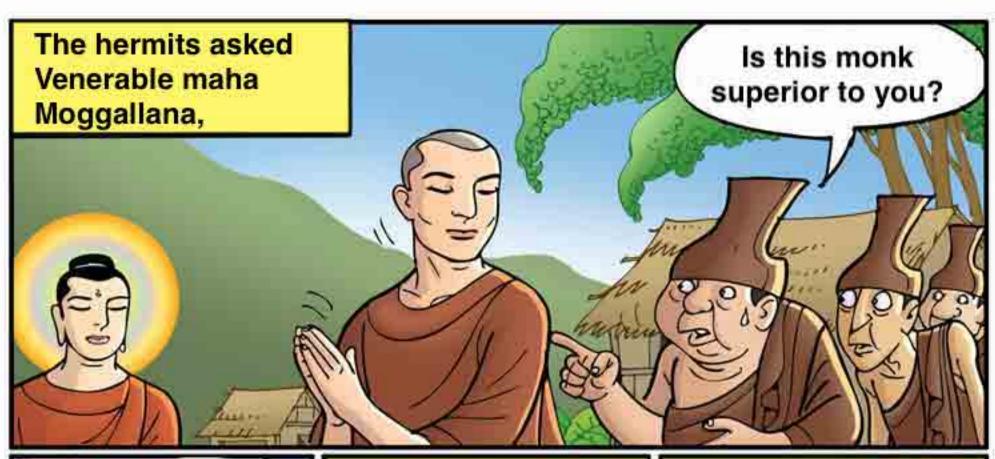
After Ahichatta's conceit,

provide cover from his hood.



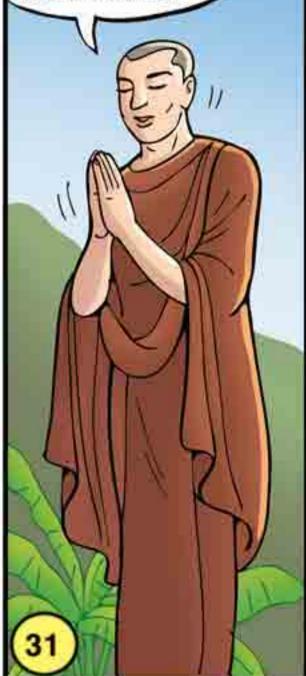


Meanwhile, our Supreme Buddha arrived on the scene and Venerable Moggallana came down the pile of sand and paid obeisance to him.

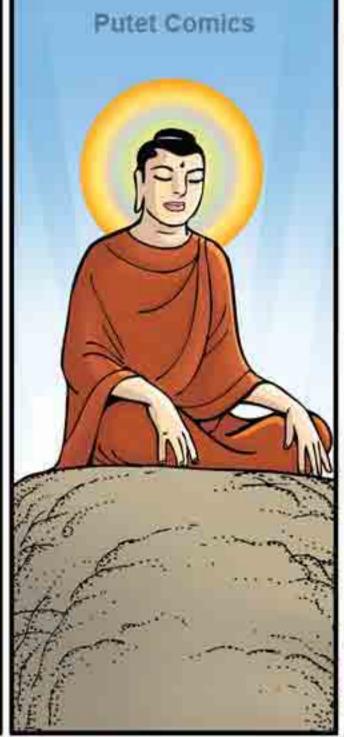




Hermits, this holy monk is my mentor. I am just a disciple of this precious monk, the Buddha!



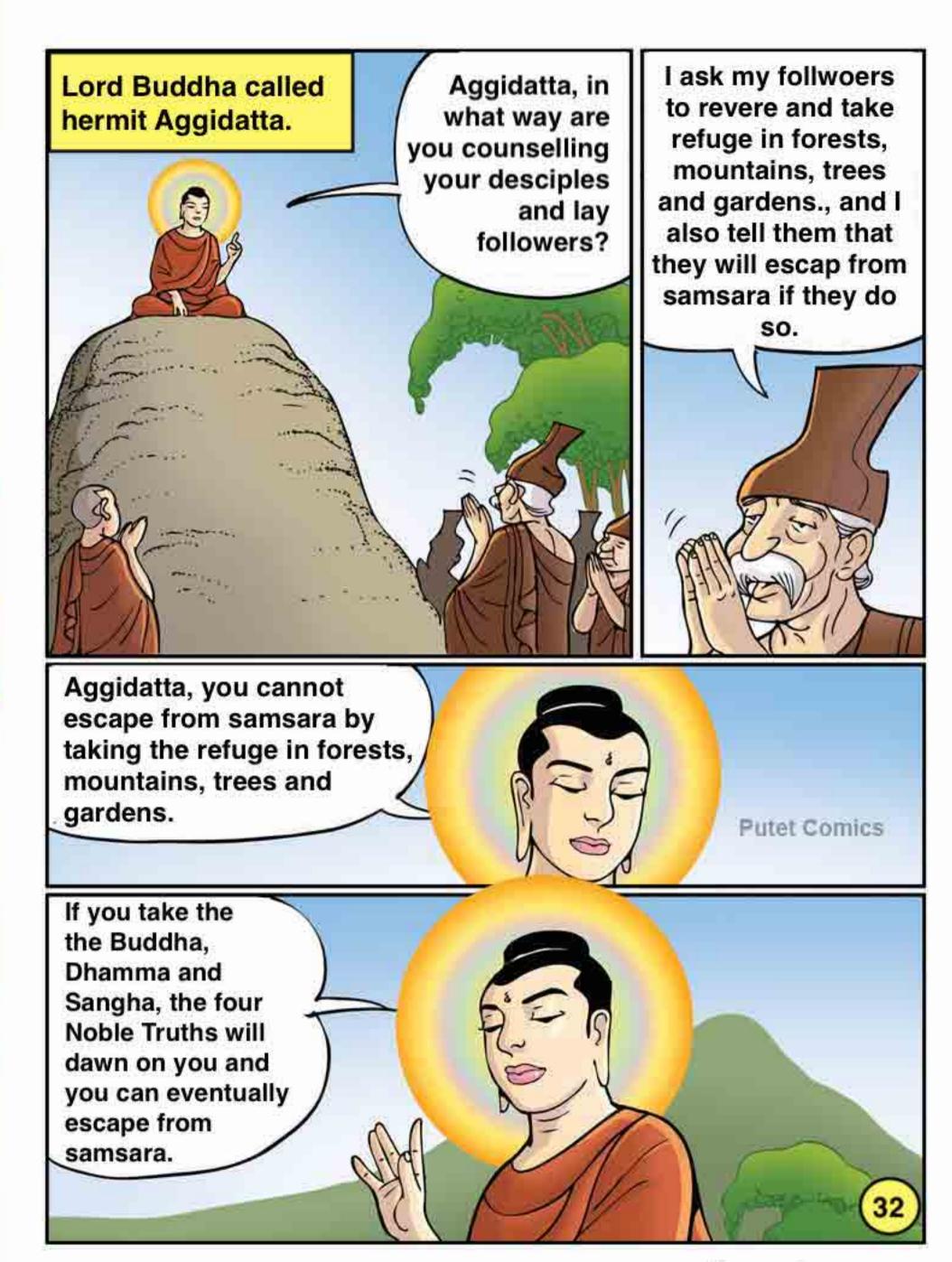
Our Supreme Buddha sat on the huge pile of sand.



The hermits lavished praise on the Buddha with their palms raised together on their foreheads.

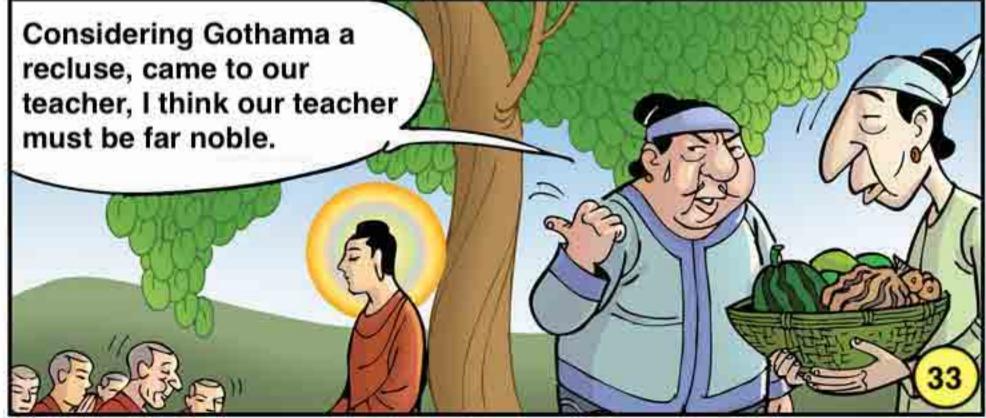
Such is the power of the disciple that he can subdue the Serpent king, I wonder how powerful the Buddha, the mentor will be.

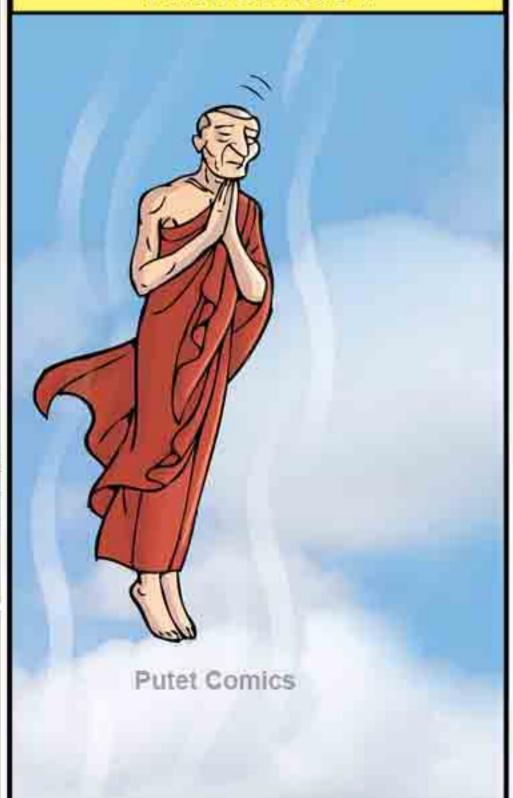




Our Supreme Buddha read people's innerself and realized they have shadow of doubt.
